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CSL Group decides for ship recycling off the beach

13 June 2013 – In its ship recycling policy published in June 2012, Montreal-based CSL Group declares its commitment to ship dismantling off the beach. The Canadian company, which is the world's largest fleet of dry-bulk self-unloading vessels, made it part of their policy to exclude or minimize hazardous substances in new built ships and to reduce hazardous substances during operation life. Moreover, CSL ships carry a Green Passport during their operational life. With regards to the dismantling process, CSL demands either pier or dock breaking and excludes the beaching method. The policy also includes the supervision of the ship recycling yard by CSL in order to make sure that its standards are being followed.
